St John the Compassionate Mission Community Council

As we look into the future, we at St John's Mission have been reflecting on the role and the necessary voice our community plays in the daily life of the Mission. As a result, we have established the Community Council. The Community Council is comprised of people from the community; for the people of the community; who represent the community. The mandate of the Council is to make St John's a welcoming place in the neighbourhood, where everyone in the community is accepted and has a voice. As a result, the council's first task, which was recently presented to, voted by, and unanimously agreed upon by the membership to changing the name of our building to St John the Compassionate Mission Neighbourhood House. This is not a legal change of the Mission name but rather of the physical structure we occupy.

The council meets once a month with the Director of Community and discusses and implements monthly initiatives in which the Council and the Mission can play a larger role in our South Riverdale neighbourhood. These initiatives are then presented to our membership for discussion and voting. We encourage everyone to come and join us on the first Thursday of each month at 10:30am for our monthly Community Membership meeting. We look forward to seeing you!
